Dear parents,

This winter has certainly thrown us all a few curve balls. As you know, we missed quite a bit of school due to the winter weather. As it stands now, the students will not be required to make up the days missed. We will also keep our half days in place as scheduled. We are working on modifying our curriculum and pacing to accommodate the missed instruction.

The winter weather also delayed the start to our new facility. During the deep freeze we had a water sprinkler pipe bust, and it caused substantial flooding to the building. This set back, along with our weather, has caused a delay in when the new construction will be available for occupancy. We were expecting this may be the case, so we have been working on our back-up plan.

We are working on many of the logistics (and will communicate them as they are decided), but we are planning on having K-5 on our existing campus (Brookmont Parkway) and 6-8 in the existing facility on our new campus. Our current timeline has us reuniting as a K-8 school on the new campus in October or November.

We know the split campus is not optimal, but we look forward to using our 7Cs to make it work! Again, more details on drop-off/pick up procedures will be forthcoming.



New Building Admission Procedures

You spoke, and we have listened! Several families indicated on the Parent Survey that, while the buzzer system is great idea, we haven't done enough to monitor who is entering the building. We agree that this is an area of improvement, and from now on we will be more diligent with screening our school visitors. All visitors who "buzz" for admittance will now be asked to identify themselves and tell the purpose of their visit to the school. Please be patient and understand that even if we know you, we will have to ask for identification. Thank you for helping us to identify an area we can improve, and for helping us to keep our children safe.

Essential 55

Brighten Academy uses Ron Clark's Essential 55 Rules as a part of our 7 C's curriculum to help develop the whole child. Please review the rules that we have covered and help us to reinforce the skills the students are learning at school.

Our Essential 55 Rule for this week is:

You should quickly learn the names of other teachers in the school and greet them by saying things like, "Good morning, Mrs. McDonald" or "Good afternoon, Mrs. Arnold. That is a very pretty dress." If you are in line with the rest of the class, the no-talking rule is in effect. However, you should speak to other teachers when entering or leaving the school, at recess, on an errand, or changing classes.

Other Essential 55 Rules we have focused on are:

When someone is speaking, you should keep your eyes on the person at all times. If someone else makes a comment, you should turn and face that person.

Throughout the year, you may receive rewards for good behavior, academic performance, and other acts worthy of praise. You should never ask for or demand a reward. It is rude for anyone to ask if they are getting a reward for good behavior. Proper classroom behavior requires students to behave well in school and at home, and do their best because they are trying to better themselves, not because they are anticipating a reward.
